# Worldview

## Definition:

A worldview is our ideas about life or the world. It is the **foundation** that your beliefs, actions, decisions and opinions are based on.



# Religious and Non-Religious Worldviews



## Religious Worldview:

- Belief in and worship of a superhuman power, especially a personal god or gods
- System of faith and worship

## Non-Religious Worldview:

- Not relating to or believing in a religion
- Usually without belief in a god or gods (or unsure)
